

CSI Museum, Timepieces, Railroad Heritage & Lunch on the Rails

Come face to face with history and be fascinated with what you will learn during a **CSI experience** at the **Heritage Center Museum**. Using the same tools as crime scene investigators, visitors will have an opportunity to learn how museums determine whether something is real or fake. Join museum President Peter Seibert as he shows you how to examine furniture, glass, paintings and more to see if they really are genuine or not. You will also have a chance to visit the Museum's exhibits that interpret Lancaster County's history and decorative arts, and shop at their lovely museum store.

Next, it's "All Aboard" the historic **Strasburg Rail Road** in Lancaster County for a dining experience flavored with turn-of-the-century charm and first class service. Be seated in the elegantly restored "**Lee E. Brenner**" **Dining Car** and journey through rolling hills and picturesque farms in the heart of Pennsylvania's Amish country. From the authentic steam locomotive to the luxurious appointments of the vintage Dining Car, dinner aboard the Strasburg Rail Road is a memorable escape to the golden age of steam railroading.

Walk next door to the **Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania**. These museum houses one of the most significant collections of historic railroad artifacts in the world and displays over 100 locomotives and cars from the mid-19th and 20th-centuries. Here you can choose between one of two behind-the-scenes tours:

- Take a Behind the Scenes Tour of the Restoration Shop to see how the staff restores many of the unique survivors back to their original appearance. **OR**,
- Opt for a "White Glove" docent-led tour to see some of the artifacts that you don't usually see in a railroad museum.



Re-board your motor coach for a ride to Columbia for a stroll through the entire history of timekeeping at the **National Watch and Clock Museum**. With over 12,000 items, the museum is recognized as the largest and most comprehensive horological collection in North America. Although the main focus of the collection is on nineteenth-century American clocks and watches, the Museum collection is international in scope and covers a wide variety of clocks, watches, tools and other time-related items.
